From 1994 to 2001 Nuschese worked at the MGM Grand. Today he is the owner of several diversified enterprises with global interests. He is president of Georgetown Entertainment Group LLC.

In 2006 Nuschese received the Award for Excellence in Business at the Sons of Italy Foundation's National Education and Leadership gala. In 2008 he received the Ellis Island Medal of Honor. Nuschese is a board member of the University of Maryland's Institute of Human Virology and of
